

## TOOL IDENTIFICATION AND USES



Macleod – Two sided blade on a long wooden handle. Used during wildfire suppression and trail restoration.



Pulaski – Combines an axe and pickaxe. Used for digging and chopping.



Grub Hoe – Available with different heads and handles. Used for bench cutting trails or keeping weeds down in gardens.



Fire Rake – Has sharp triangular teeth with long handle. Used for clearing trail of brush.



Shovel – Use spade shovel for digging and flat shovel for packing.



Root Jack – Hand operated tool with a long wooden handle with two metal grippers. Used to uproot weeds, shrubs, small trees, etc.



Weed Whip – Cutting edges mounted on long wooden handles. Used for cutting small weeds and brush close to ground.



Brush Saw – Gas powered machine. Used to cut through light-to-medium thick brushing.



Pole Saw – Gas, electric or hand powered. Used to easily reach and trim branches.



Folding Saw – Small, portable saw. Used for cutting small limbs.



Bow Saw – Handy, short or long blade with handle. Can be used instead of a chainsaw for cutting through logs and trees.



Machete – Sharp long blade with handle. Used for hacking through thick brush.



Sandvik – Short, thick, sharp blade on long handle. Similar to a machete but steadier with the longer handle.



Axe – Heavy duty blade with long handle. Used for chopping wood or large tree.



Rock Bar – Heavy steel pry bar. Used for prying big rock, logs or stumps from the ground.



Fork – Has several tines or prongs on long handle. Used for shoveling twigs, straw, etc.



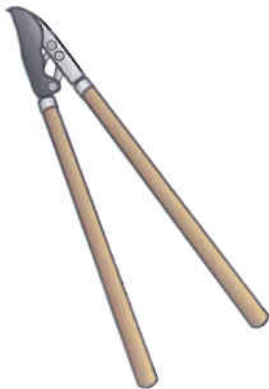
Pick – Two sided pick on short handle. Used to break, pry or loosen heavy soil and gravel. Also used to dig a trench or hole.



Bow Rake – Heavy duty with stationary prongs. Used for soil and rocks.



Leaf Rake – Light duty with flexible prongs. Used for leafs and grass.



Loppers – Type of scissor. Used for pruning twigs and small branches.



**Bastard File** – Hand tool with sharp teeth. Used for sharpening, smoothing and polishing.



**Auger** – Powered or manual drilling device with a rotating screw blade. Used for digging post holes.



**Post Hole Digger** – Manual drilling device. Used for digging post holes.



**Fence Post Pounder** – Manual or automatic device. Used for pounding in fence posts.



Fence Pliers – Hand tool. Used for cutting fence and wire, twist wire and pound in nails and staples.



Pry Bar – Steel bar that provides leverage. Used for prying and lifting.



Wire Stretcher – Hand tool that attaches to wire fencing. Used to tighten a fence properly.



Trowel – Hand tool used in gardens. Used for digging, smoothing or moving around small amounts of dirt.



Pruners – Small hand tool used in gardens. Used for cut plants, flowers, or thin pieces of wood.



Rabbiting Spade - Narrow head tool with long handle. Used for moving plants and shrubs. Can also be used to dig holes.
